Humane Society stages public execution of pets

SAN MATEO, Calif. — In an attempt to jolt public concern over the plight of thousands of unwanted animals in San Mateo County, the Peninsula Humane Society sponsored a public execution Thursday to promote what could be the nation's first all-out ban on cat and dog breeding.

A tan-and-gray calico cat and her four tiger-striped kittens were injected in the stomach with poison from a bottle marked "Fatal Plus" while cameras clicked and onlookers

gasped.

The five cats and three dogs were euthanized during a news conference as part of a grisly public awareness campaign the Humane Society began this week to promote a proposed ordinance that could ban for years any breeding of cats and dogs in San Mateo County.
