

## Movie Sushi

A while ago the TOEFL (Test Of English as a Fun Language) average scores of Asian countries were released, and the list is highly entertaining. Topping the list is Singapore, followed by Mauritius and India. China comes in ninth, South Korea eighteenth and Thailand twenty third. Traipsing in next to last and therefore winning the prestigious TOEFL booby prize, is Japan, settled right below the wealthy and prosperous island nation of Kiribati and just above one of the few remaining bastions of communism, North Korea.

Japanese officials rightly poir out that Japan had the highest number of test takers (22° 73' to China's 144,535 and Kiribau's 31) and therefore has an excuse for its embarrassingly low average, but those same officials probably do not even want to hazard a guess a. the comparable amount of money that each nation has invested in English educati .... frightening thought. 1. Japanese way. (Facts and Figures: 225,939 people took the test in Japan. In order to make a good showing, they all took lessons in "How To Pass TOEFL" for at least two years before the test. These lessons, plus the fee for taking the test, came to an average of ¥500,000 per person, which works out to US\$4,347 a head at ¥115 to the dollar. This comes to a total of \$982,156,833. And it's only the beginning. Most students have to try the test two or three times before nassing; good bitsiness by any indards. The amount invested is rerefore well over \$1 billion, ertainly enough to buy Kiribati with bit left over and certainly better 's is a fine example of how radistribution of wealth works in English education in Japan.
