Dear Editor,

The reason why the fur industry is dying is because people are nowadays much more informed about its production and have turned their backs on these symbols of animal cruelty. Unfortunately, the Japanese, as yet unaware of the real facts of fur, still associate it with fashion and glamour.

As Linda McCartney once said, "If slaughterhouses had glass walls people would stop eating meat". Once you know the facts it's difficult to eat, wear or buy any product of torture. We who speak up for the millions of creatures who suffer unseen, linger in agony, die in terror, whether in slaughterhouse, mountain or laboratory, are not trying to assume a 'holier than thou' posture as K.F. (7 March 1993) seems to facetiously imply.
