PENALITIES

The penalties under the 1911 Protection of Animals Act, which is the legislation under which most convictions were secured, are a maximum fine of up to £2,000 and/or up to six months in prison. A total of 53 defendants received prison sentences ranging from half a day to six months. Magistrates also have the power to ban people from owning an animal for a discretionary period. The majority of bans imposed were on owning dogs, with the disqualification period ranging from six months to life.

Legal costs incurred by the RSPCA for prosecuting offenders during 1990 amounted to £595,994. The courts awarded £336,579 in costs of which, to date (7.3.91), the Society has recovered £125,199. This year the Society has budgeted a sum of £800,000 for prosecutions. Keeping animals in care while waiting for cases to come to court is also a costly business. Last year boarding fees came to £239,00%.

RESCUES AND INSPECTIONS

During 1990 RSPCA Inspectors visited a total of 16,936 establishments including pet shops, markets, stables, zoos, slaughterhouses and breeding kennels. The force carried out a total of 2,530 rescues of animals, ranging from cats trapped up trees to sheep stranded on cliff faces. A total of 347 badgers, 1,319 foxes and 2,678 swans were collected plus 28,964 other miscellaneous wild animals. Iarge numbers were successfully returned to the wild including 1,524 swans.
