

manner in keeping with the kind of dog or cat, stage of growth of the dog or cat, and other factors.

2. Maintenance of health

The owner or possessor of a dog or cat should remove external parasites from the dog or cat, prevent disease, and otherwise maintain the health of the dog or cat.

3. Exercise

The owner or possessor of a dog should provide it with adequate exercise in keeping with the kind of dog, the stage of growth of the dog, the state of health of the dog, and other factors.

4. Facilities for looking after dogs or cats
The owner or possessor of dogs or cats should look after the dogs or cats in a proper manner, taking into account the kind of dogs or cats, the habits of the dogs or cats, and the number kept and the purpose for which the dogs or cats are kept, and must establish facilities (hereinafter called "facilities") to look after said dogs and cats where necessary.

III. Prevention of Damage

1. Prevention of dogs' running loose
The owner or possessor of a dog should ensure that the dog is not allowed to run loose.

2. Prevention of escape
The owner or possessor of a dog should take whatever steps are necessary to prevent the dog from escaping from the facilities.

3. Tying up

The owner or possessor of a dog shall make sure that in tying up the dog, the range of the movement of the dog does not interfere with any roadway or accessway.

4. Discipline and training

The owner or possessor of a dog shall train said dog at such times and by such methods that are appropriate to the purpose for which the dog is kept and,

in particular, shall train the dog to obey the commands of the owner or possessor.

5. Matters to be noted concerning exercise

The owner or possessor of a dog should adhere to the following matters when exercising the dog on roadways or out of doors:

- (1) The dog shall be exercised, in principle, on a leash by a person capable of controlling the dog.
- (2) Care must be paid to the condition of the leash and its use so that the owner or possessor is able to cope with any sudden movement by the dog.
- (3) Full consideration shall be given to the place and time of exercise and other such matters.

IV. Conservation of the Living Environment

1. Prevention of damage and destruction

The owner or possessor of a dog or cat should ensure that no park, roadway or other public place, or land or building belonging to another person, is damaged or destroyed by the dog or cat or is fouled by the feces of the dog or cat.

2. Prevention of obnoxious odors

The owner or possessor of a dog or cat should prevent the occurrence of noxious odors by keeping facilities for the disposal of feces and urine clean at all times.

V. Other Matters

1. Restriction of breeding

An owner who does not wish his dog or cat to breed should take steps to prevent reproduction by surgical means such as castration or spaying, or by other methods.

2. Transfer or placing in custody

(1) Where the owner of a dog or cat is unavoidably unable to continue to keep said dog or cat, the owner should transfer said dog or cat to a person who is
