crete factory and its nearby head office.

"Almost all the facilities are gone. We, the workers, are totally at a loss, since our lives have been heavily dependent on the industry," said a middle-aged seasonal employee who also works as a farmer in the Tajima area of northern Hyogo Prefecture from spring through fall.

"I hope the national government will offer some relief measures in case we are

unemployed," he said.

Another brewer, Kyoto-based Takara Shuzo, said in suffered an estimated ¥1 billion in damage to its plant in Nada Ward.

"It (the quake happened at the most important time for us brewers," Misato said.

Sake brewing in the area is assumily in full swing between November and March, as sake ferments well when exposed to the cold northern wind blowing from the Rokkin Mouritiers, he said.

Of the 50 horaers in the area about 40 are small companies. Uke Duikoku Masswhich brew in the traditional waymaking most of their sake in wood build mes in winter.
