statistics mentioning how much of each pound point most to the animals, but carefully omitting any reference to what happens to the pounds UNspent! IFAW does not seem to have charity status in the U.K. at least, for there is no mention of it on any of their literature. If this is the care, then it is not obliged by law to spend its funds, as regardered charities are. I suppose one could say that if at least some of the funds reach some of the animals, then we could be satisfied that something is being done! However, I know many neople who would not be satisfied with such in dishonest situation; and I know many people in the U.K. who have become very suspicious of IPAW's activities since the false dapamese earthquake appeal information, and who have declared they will not support IFAW ever again; certainly not renew my IPAW membership, nor denste and thing further. I am so sorry you are involved with such an organisation, Kyenan.

I will be returning the Korean animal protos and literature very soon. I asked the denors you sent copies of books to, to return them after they had finished looking through them. They could be put to better use in Korea - or perhaps the U.S. I think your photos are really excellent and wonder why IPAW is not using them. They should be mut to good use for picture postcard campaigns before they become too dated. Your Korean campaign, though not necessarily ilroctly connected to KAPS, should surely be onguing a since the problem itself is. However, with the appeal value of the Japanese earthquake, the impending resumption of whaling and possibly of sed! slaughter, too, you may have tough competition in keeping Korea to the forefront of IFAW's promotional priorities, but I certainly believe it should have equal importance with other crises.
