ANIMAL APPEAL TO LANDOWNERS

An animal rescue team working in the Kobe earthquake area has made an urgent appeal for land where they can build temporary shelters for dogs and cats rescued from the rubble.

The International Fund for Animal Welfare (IFAW) is coordinating rescue work involving hundreds of animals - mostly dogs and cats. Based at the Animal Rescue Kansai sanctuary (ARK) at Nose Cho near Osaka, the IFAW team have already arranged extra buildings there but have run out of space.

IFAW coordinator Annemieke Roell said: "We are desperate to find suitable land to put up more animal shelters. The task here is enormous with animals coming in daily. We only need the land on a temporary basis."
